Condition	Some customers may comment when the dome light off switch is pressed, which disables the dome lights when the doors are opened, that initially the system is working properly. But if the vehicle is turned off and allowed to completely go asleep, the next time they open a door the dome lights turn on.
Cause	None.

Correction

None, the vehicle is operating as designed and the dome on/off switch will need to be cycled off again to disable the dome lights.
