**Summary:** Michelin (Michelin North America, Inc.) has notified NHTSA that certain models Michelin X Works XZY, size 315/80R22.5 156/150K, manufactured from January 1, 2011, to July 31, 2015 fail to confirm to the requirements of Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard (FMVSS) No. 119, "New Pneumatic Tires for Motor Vehicles with a GVWR of more than 4,536 kilograms (10,000 pounds) and Motorcycles." The affected tires lack the required DOT symbol and load range letter designation.
