# PURPOSE

During initial acceleration from a standstill, or when accelerating again after either constant speed operation or coasting down, affected CVT equipped vehicles may experience a hesitation if the range switch momentarily experiences a loss of signal.

This Safety Recall Bulletin provides instructions for reprogramming the CVT–ECU with a modified software. The modified software ignores the momentary loss of the range switch signal.

# BACKGROUND

When the range switch momentarily experiences a loss of signal, the CVT–ECU believes that the driver has manually shifted the selector from neutral (N) to drive (D) while the throttle is open. In response, the CVT–ECU instructs the engine ECU to reduce its torque output to prevent "shift shock" and slippage of the CVT metal belt. This reduction in engine torque can directly affect vehicle acceleration and would be perceived by the driver as vehicle hesitation.

# **IMPORTANT**

Affected new or used inventory vehicles must be repaired before the vehicle is delivered. Dealers must check their inventory vehicles' VINs on the Warranty Superscreen to verify whether the vehicle is involved in this recall campaign. It is a violation of Federal law for a dealer to deliver a new motor vehicle or any new or used item of motor vehicle equipment (including a tire) covered by the notification under a sale or lease until the defect or noncompliance is remedied.

## **REQUIRED OPERATIONS**

- 1. Confirm your MUT–III is updated with the latest reprogramming database.
- 2. Reprogram the CVT-ECU with the new software. Refer to the CVT-ECU Reprogramming Chart for new software information.

# NOTE: Reprogramming can only be performed with MUT–III, not MUT3–SE.

**IMPORTANT:** If an affected vehicle has a Malfunction Indicator Lamp (MIL) illuminated <u>before</u> reprogramming, and DTCs are listed in the TCM memory, diagnose and repair those DTCs per the service manual <u>before</u> reprogramming. **DO NOT** reprogram the CVT–ECU until the reason(s) for other DTCs being set is corrected.

- MEDIC 3.5/4 update at **408** or higher.
- For Standalone MUT–III units, MUT–III Reprogramming Database N16071 or higher.

# **REPAIR PROCEDURE**

1. Verify that the CVT-ECU has not already been updated to the latest S/W number in the table above. If the CVT-ECU is at the latest level, reprogramming is not necessary.



# For MEDIC 3.5/4 users only: (MUT–III users go to step

. Verify the MEDIC 3.5/4 is at version 3.5 and at update **408** or higher.

If your <u>MEDIC 3.5/4 update is at least 408</u>, continue with the Reprogramming Procedure on page 4.

If your <u>MEDIC 3.5/4 update is below 408</u>, update your MEDIC as follows.

Select the MEDIC 3.5/4 Admin tab and click on "Updates."

IF the MEDIC update screen advises updates are available, click the "Begin" button. After all updates are complete, <u>GO TO THE REPROGRAMMING</u> <u>PROCEDURE.</u>

- STANDALONE MUT-III SCAN TOOL VIEWER (STV) ONLY: (MEDIC 3.5 USERS GO TO THE REPROGRAMMING PROCEDURE). Verify that your MUT-III has the most current version of the reprogramming database: From the MUT-III Main Page:
  - Select "Special Function"
  - Select "ECU Reprogramming"
  - Select "Database File Display—CAN"
  - Confirm the database number displayed at the top right of the chart is N16071 **or higher**
  - If the database number displayed on your MUT–III is N16071 or greater, continue to the Reprogramming Procedure.
  - If the reprogramming database number displayed on your MUT–III is lower than N16071, locate the reprogramming CD containing database N16071 and follow the instructions provided with the CD to update your MUT–III.

#### **REPROGRAMMING PROCEDURE**

# N To ensure that the vehicle battery maintains 12V during the procedure, hook—up a battery charger to the vehicle during the procedure.

- 1. Connect the equipment as follows:
  - Turn the MEDIC PC/tablet on. If the battery indicator in the lower right hand corner of the screen does not show a full charge, it is recommended that either the battery be charged prior to beginning, or be used with the A/C power adaptor connected.
  - Connect the USB cable to the VCI/VCI Lite.
  - When the laptop/tablet displays the MUT–III main screen, connect the USB cable to the device.
  - Connect the MUT-III main harness with the blue DLC connection to the VCI/VCI Lite.
  - Connect the blue connection of the MUT–III main harness to the vehicle's data link connector.
  - Turn the VCI power switch ON . Verify that the indicator lamp in the upper right corner of the screen is green.

- 2. Turn the ignition switch to the "ON" position.
  - If using MEDIC, from the main page, click the MUT-III STV icon at the top center of the screen to open MUT-III.

Verify that the MUT–III/STV is at version 35 or later.

# NOTE: Reprogramming can only be performed with MUT–III, not MUT3–SE.

- 4. Click "System select."
  - Press the model information display button (car icon) and verify that all vehicle information is correct.
    - If vehicle information is NOT correct, follow steps a – c below.
    - If vehicle information is correct, click the check mark at the bottom of the page, then go to step 8.

a. If the VIN or vehicle description displayed does not match the vehicle you are working on, click the eraser icon at the bottom of the page to erase

If a message appears saying the VIN cannot be input automatically, manually enter the 17 digit VIN into the VIN field at the top of the page.

Make sure the VIN is correct and click the check mark.

- c. Confirm all data matches the vehicle, then click on "Transmission."
- d. Select the appropriate transmission, then click the check mark.





NOTE: In the next step, if the "pop-up" box does not appear, change "Tab" to TIR then back to MUT-III (the pop-up box should then appear).



10. A message will advise the system will "Automatic search the data."

Click the check mark to continue.

If the message seen at left is displayed, the ECU software is already at the most current level. Do not continue with the reprogramming procedure. This Recall is complete; note on the RO that the flash was not necessary and still submit a recall claim.

Click the check mark to clear the window, then click the Home icon at the lower left corner of the screen to return to the System Select main page.

Turn the ignition switch to the OFF position and disconnect the MUT–III. Turn off and disconnect the battery charger. Conduct normal diagnosis per the service manual.

If a "Complete Reprogramming" message <u>does not</u> appear, continue with the reprogramming procedure.

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- 11. The Automatic Reprogramming (CAN) database screen will display.
  - Verify that the new ECU and S/W part numbers are listed in the table.
  - Confirm the database number at the top right of the table is N16071 or higher.
  - If more than one row is displayed in the table, refer to the TCM Reprogramming Chart on page 2 to highlight and select the correct row.
  - Click the check mark to continue.
- 12. The "Check reprogramming data" window should appear with the new file name.
  - **NOTE:** Refer to the CVT-ECU Reprogramming Chart on page 2 for the new file names.
- 13. Click on the check mark in the pop-up box to initiate the reprogramming.
- 14. Once the reprogramming is initiated, the screen as shown will indicate the reprogramming progress.
  - NOTE: Do not disturb the cables or turn off the ignition during reprogramming.

**CAUTION** The Daytime Running Lights and both the engine and condenser fans will automatically be turned on during reprogramming. Care should be taken to ensure nothing gets caught in the moving blades. These are normal conditions.

2) Select the appropriate option for the vehicle. Repeat steps 1 and 2 for all underlined systems.

3) Click on the check mark. Wait until MUT-III is finished and click the check mark again to confirm.

20. Test drive the vehicle to confirm proper operation and the MIL does not illuminate.

This notice has been sent to you in accordance with the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act.

Mitsubishi Motors North America, Inc. (MMNA) has decided that defects which relates to motor vehicle safety exists in certain 2015 Outlander Sport vehicles.
(1) The hose clamp(s) used on the continuously variable transmission (CVT) fluid hoses may not have been "released" on some vehicles during the vehicle assembly line process. These hose clamp(s), if left in the open position, may not properly secure the hose end to the fitting and the hose could become disconnected from the fitting during vehicle operation. If this occurs, transmission fluid will leak out of the disconnected hose and may result in loss of drive train power and the vehicle could become inoperable. While the subject transmission hoses are not located adjacent to the exhaust manifold or the battery, transmission fluid in the presence of an ignition source can also present a fire hazard.
(2) During initial acceleration from a standstill, or when accelerating again after either constant speed operation or coasting down, affected CVT equipped vehicles may experience a hesitation if the range switch momentarily experiences a loss of signal. If the range switch momentarily experiences a loss of signal, this may result in reduced vehicle acceleration. Unexpected reduction in available acceleration during every day driving, such as acceleration from a stop, merging on to a freeway, or turning left against traffic, could result in an increased risk of an accident.
Please contact your local Authorized Mitsubishi Motors dealer and schedule an appointment to have these recall remedies performed on your vehicle. When you bring your vehicle in, please show the dealer this letter. (If you misplace this letter, the dealer will still perform this inspection/repair to your vehicle, free of charge.)
The dealership will inspect all transmission hose clamps to confirm that they are not in the open position; clamps found in the open position will be released. The dealership will also reprogram the CVT-ECU with a modified software.
