

The repair quality of covered vehicles is extremely important to Toyota. All dealership technicians performing this recall are required to successfully complete the most current version of the E-Learning course "Safety Recall and Service Campaign Essentials". To ensure that all vehicles have the repair performed correctly; technicians performing this recall repair are required to currently hold <u>at least one</u> of the following certification levels:

- Certified Technician (Chassis)
- Expert Technician (Chassis)
- Master Technician
- Master Diagnostic Technician

It is the dealership's responsibility to select technicians with the above certification level or greater to perform this recall repair. Carefully review your resources, the technician skill level, and ability before assigning technicians to this repair. It is important to consider technician days off and vacation schedules to ensure there are properly trained technicians available to perform this repair at all times.

II. IDENTIFICATION OF AFFECTED VEHICLES

- 1. CHECK VEHICLE FOR CAMPAIGN ELIGIBILITY
 - a. Compare the vehicles VIN to the VIN listed on the Repair Order to ensure they match.
 - b. Check the TIS Vehicle Inquiry System to confirm the VIN is involved in this Recall, and that it has not already been complete

Note: TMNA warranty will not reimburse dealers for repairs completed on vehicles that are not affected or were previously completed, even by another dealer.







IV. BACKGROUND

A screw attaching the cover to the electric power steering gear may not have been installed or properly tightened. A loose or missing screw could allow water to enter and, over time, damage the steering gear, causing a loss of power steering assist. This can result in increased steering effort at low vehicle speeds and increases the risk of a crash.

















VI. STEERING GEAR REMOVAL

1. REMOVE COWL VENTILATOR PANEL SUB-ASSEMBLY



b. Detach the clamps (with Windshield deicer system equipped only)




- c. Detach the clamp
- d. Remove the 4 bolts, 4 nuts and cowl ventilator panel subassembly



2. REMOVE FUEL DELIVERY GUARD

a. Remove the bolt and fuel delivery guard from the engine mounting bracket RH.



3. INSTALL ENGINE HANGERS

a. Install the No. 1 engine hanger and No. 2 engine hanger with the 4 bolts as shown in the illustration.

Torque:

43 N·m {438 kgf·cm, 32 ft·lbf}

4. INSTALL ENGINE SUPPORT BAR

a. Assemble the engine support bar according to the instructions in the link below.




The steps listed below in the repair manual should NOT be followed.

8. REMOVE ENGINE ASSEMBLY WITH TRANSAXLE

NOTE: At step 8. REMOVE ENGINE ASSEMBLY WITH TRANSAXLE the following process must be performed.

- b. Remove the No.1 Engine Under Cover
- c. Remove the No. 2 Engine Under Cover
- d. Separate the Front Stabilizer Link Assembly LH and RH from the Sway Bar Assembly
- e. Disconnect the Front Lower No.1 Suspension Arm Sub-assembly LH and RH from the Front Lower Ball Joint Assembly LH and RH
- f. Disconnect the Front and Rear Engine Mount from the Front Frame assembly

NOTE: At step 8. REMOVE ENGINE ASSEMBLY WITH TRANSAXLE the following process must be performed.

- g. Remove the 2 bolts (A), 2 bolts (B), 4 nuts, front bumper extension sub-assembly LH and the front bumper extension sub-assembly RH from the frame assembly and vehicle body
- h. Remove the 2 bolts (C), 4 bolts (D), the rear front suspension member brace LH, and rear front suspension brace RH from the front frame assembly and body of the vehicle.
- i. After removing the front frame assembly continue on to step 9. REMOVE STEERING GEAR HEAT INSULATOR of the repair manual to continue the removal of the steering gear assembly

NOTE: The labor for this repair only includes front toe adjustment. Front camber and caster adjustments, as well as rear alignment adjustments are not covered

■ VERIFY REPAIR QUALITY ▶

- Check the steering wheel is aligned properly while driving
- . Confirm there is no interference between the tire and body when turning
- Check the power steering assist system is operational, there are no DTC's, and the EPS warning indicator is OFF


