

# Recall 232: Power Relay Assembly – Remedy Not Available - Dealer Best Practice July 1, 2022

<u>Important:</u> As required by federal law, dealers must not deliver new vehicles for sale or for lease to customers until all open recalls have been performed. Dealers must also perform all open recalls on used vehicles, demo, and rental vehicles prior to placing them into customer use and whenever an affected vehicle is in the shop for any maintenance or repair.

## **Important notice regarding Related Recall 178:**

Recall 178 will stay open until Recall 232's remedy is available.

## **Description of Campaign:**

Hyundai is initiating a safety recall to address a condition involving the Power Relay Assembly ("PRA") in vehicles repaired under Recall 178, a safety recall addressing a similar condition, issued in October 2018. Hyundai is initiating this action to ensure the safety of its vehicles for Hyundai customers.

The subject vehicles may not have received the proper remedy components under Recall 178, a safety recall addressing an electrical pin fit condition on the main relays within the PRA that, if continually operated in this condition, could increase electrical resistance thereby generating heat and increasing the risk of a fire.

## **Affected Vehicles:**

- ➤ Certain 2017-18MY Hyundai Ioniq Hybrid and Ioniq Plug-in Hybrid Vehicles produced between 11/16/2016 08/16/2017
- ➤ To check vehicle specific recall applicability, access the "Vehicle Information" screen via WebDCS.
- For this recall, please note that there are no vehicles currently in dealer stock.

# **Remedy Information:**

The remedy is currently under development and additional information will be provided once it has been developed for release. Training recommendations will also be made available when the remedy is ready.

**Recommended Alternative Transportation**: It is recommended that Service Rental Cars (SRCs) are made available for customers that are concerned with the safe operation of their vehicle prior to release of remedy.

## FAQs:

#### Q1: What is the issue?

**A1:** The subject vehicles may not have received the proper remedy components under Recall 178, a safety recall addressing an electrical pin fit condition on the main relays within the PRA (Power Relay Assembly) that, if continually operated in this condition, could increase electrical resistance thereby generating heat and increasing the risk of a fire.

#### Q2: What is the safety concern?

**A2:** Increased electrical resistance between the main relay contacts may increase the risk of a thermal event, including the potential for a fire.

#### Q3: Have there been any accidents or injuries?

A3: As of the date of the filing (06/27/22) to NHTSA, there are no related crashes, injuries, or reported incidents in the U.S.

## Q4: What will be done during this recall service at the dealer?

**A4:** Once an official remedy is available, all owners of the subject vehicles will be notified by first class mail with instructions to bring their vehicles to a Hyundai dealer to have the remedy completed free of charge, regardless of whether the affected vehicles are still covered under Hyundai's New Vehicle Limited Warranty.

#### Q5: What if the owner incurred out-of-pocket expenses for obtaining a remedy for the recall condition?

**A5:** Hyundai will provide owners of affected vehicles reimbursement for out-of-pocket expenses incurred to obtain a remedy for the recall condition in accordance with the reimbursement plan submitted to NHTSA on February 24.2022.

#### Q6: Will a Stop Sale be issued?

**A6:** No, a stop sale will be issued as the affected vehicles are no longer in production.

#### Q7: Will this Recall 232 supersede previous Recall 178 for the Power Relay Assembly?

**A7:** Recall 178 will remain open until a remedy is available for Recall 232. Once a remedy is available for Recall 232, Recall 178 will be inactivated.
