Condition/Concern

A customer may comment that the audio is skipping while streaming music using Bluetooth.

Recommendation/Instructions

Streaming music through Bluetooth uses a lot of the radio's processing resources. If the radio is also dedicating a large amount of resources to other applications such as navigation, booting, XM Weather, etc.., the Bluetooth audio may hesitate/skip as the system is being heavily loaded. This condition is a normal operating characteristic of the vehicle. It will not impact the designed performance or reliability of the vehicle.

Some recommendations that may help to alleviate the concern are;

- Free up resources on the radio by unplugging unneeded devices, cancelling navigation if not needed, waiting until after the radio completes the boot up sequence, etc...
- Free up resources on the phone by closing all open apps including unneeded apps running in the background
- Make sure that the device is on the most up to date software version
