Subject: Cadillac ELR (EREV) Outside Rearview Mirror Charge Indicator LED Intermittent Operation During Charging

Models: 2014-2015 Cadillac ELR

The following diagnosis might be helpful if the vehicle exhibits the symptom(s) described in this PI.

Condition/Concern

A customer may comment that the Outside Rearview Mirror Charge Indicator LED may be intermittently inoperative.

Recommendation/Instructions

This concern may be difficult to duplicate and there may not be any DTCs stored.

- Check for a poor connection between the terminals at the Outside Rearview Mirror Charge Indicator LED Lens assembly and the harness connector. The terminals on the circuit board located inside the Lens may not extend outward far enough to engage and make proper contact with the female terminals in the harness connector when the connector is locked into position.
- Check the date code located on the sticker that is mounted on the inner side of the Outside Rearview Mirror Charge Indicator LED Lens assembly.



If the date on the sticker adhered to the backside of the Outside Rearview Mirror Charge Indicator LED Lens assembly is earlier than June, 2014, the Outside Rearview Mirror Charge Indicator LED Lens assembly will need to be replaced.

Currently, the existing service parts stock is being sorted. Until this PI is updated to include a replacement part number, please call GM Technical Assistance to establish a TAC case. A part with a date code later than June 2014 will be shipped directly from the supplier to your dealership.
