6.7L - 4WD - Grinding Noise Heard On Coast Down Prior to 4-3 Downshift - ^{29 June 2022} Built On Or Before 16-May-2022

Model:

Ford	Engine: 6.7L
2022 F-Super Duty	Built on or before 16-May-2022

Issue: Some 2022 F-Super Duty four-wheel drive (4WD) pickup vehicles built on or before 16-May-2022 equipped with a 6.7L engine may exhibit a momentary, slight grinding type noise prior to the 4-3 downshift while coasting without the brakes applied. This may be due to the software in the transmission control module (TCM). To correct the condition, follow the Service Procedure to reprogram the TCM and powertrain control module (PCM).

Action: Follow the Service Procedure to correct the condition on vehicles that meet all of the following criteria:

- 2022 F-Super Duty
- Built on or before 16-May-2022
- 6.7L engine
- 4WD
- Pickup
- Exhibits a momentary, slight grinding type noise prior to the 4-3 downshift while coasting without the brakes applied

Warranty Status: Eligible under provisions of New Vehicle Limited Warranty (NVLW)/Service Part Warranty (SPW)/Special Service Part (SSP)/Extended Service Plan (ESP) coverage. Limits/policies/prior approvals are not altered by a TSB. NVLW/SPW/SSP/ESP coverage limits are determined by the identified causal part and verified using the OASIS part coverage tool.

Service Procedure

1. Reprogram the TCM and PCM using the latest software version of the Ford Diagnosis and Repair System (FDRS) scan tool.

NOTE: Advise the customer this vehicle is equipped with an adaptive transmission shift strategy which allows the vehicle's computer to learn the transmission's unique parameters and improve shift quality. When the adaptive strategy is reset, the computer will begin a relearning process. This relearning process may result in firmer than normal upshifts and downshifts for several days.
